“God Is Spoken of Here”

Two women of great faith and vision came together for a brief encounter, and we at Young People Who Care live out the fruits of that meeting.

Prior to establishing YPWC in Frenchville, PA, Sr. Therese Dush met with Catherine Doherty, foundress of Madonna House Lay Apostolate in Combermere, Ontario, Canada. Catherine was a pioneer among North American Catholic laity in implementing the Church’s social doctrine. She insisted that those engaged in social action be rooted in prayer and that they incarnate their faith into every aspect of ordinary life. Sr. Therese received a distinct inner call to serve the needs of the poor and disenfranchised of Appalachia.

Sr. Therese asked Catherine to meet to discern how to live out this inner call. During their time together Catherine encouraged Therese, saying, “If it were me, I would get a little house and put up a sign that says, ‘God is spoken of here’ and when people ask what the meaning of those words are, you should reply, ‘Are you interested or are you just curious?’ If they say they are just curious you can tell them to get the hell off your porch. But if they say they are interested you should invite them in and break bread with them.” With this Catherine reached for bread and shared it with Sr. Therese. Thus, YPWC has one of its founding inspirations, “God is Spoken of Here.”

In the summer of 1977, our small community of volunteers studied Catherine’s book, *The Gospel Without Compromise*. It proved to be a wonderful foundation for us as we read **“We need to beg the Holy Spirit to lead us in the right direction. If we look for the paths that God is already laying out for us, a new awareness, a new vitality and a new sense of challenge and adventure will come into our hearts. We need to be ready to follow Christ wherever he goes, for Christ has a way of going into unexpected places. He often directs us toward an end that we don’t yet perceive but that is just around the corner.”**

Sr. Therese inspired us to live this clear and compelling Gospel call at YPWC without compromise, to live it with a passionate love for God and for our neighbor through prayer, hospitality, simplicity and service. We continue, especially this Lent and into Easter, to follow the example of these two women of deep faith who put their profound love for Jesus into action.

Young People Who Care provides a wide ecumenical circle of care among those who give and those who receive. Its members are committed to creating a holistic and non-judgmental environment where the exchange of culture, education and training empower individuals and groups.

While adapting to changing needs and times, prayer, hospitality, simplicity and service remain constant characteristics of Young People Who Care, Inc.
